Archaeological Dig

Q. What is it like to be an archaeologist?

A huge THANK YOU to the team of archaeologists that came and dug a huge trench for us to explore. The children were so engrossed in the task, using the specialist tools to search and extract artefacts. We found the remains of the old swimming pool, a stone wall, metal pipes and other scraps, buttons and other historical artefacts all buried beneath the ground. It was a fantastic day. We have left the trench open for children to show you the ‘dig’ and will be opening a ‘museum’ of things we found.



Horsham Museum Visit

Ash and Sycamores took part in a fantastic workshop with Horsham museum this week. The children learned hands on about the gruesome process of mummification and handled lots of interesting artefacts.

In 2023, the school terms are shorter so clubs will run for the whole term instead of half-termly. This means less paperwork for parents and is easier for the school and outside providers to manage.

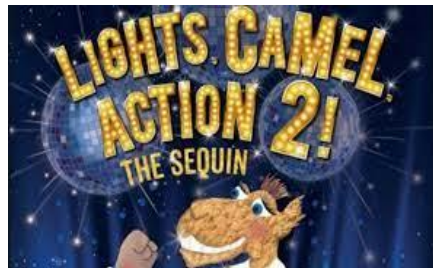
Letters will be out next week. If any children change clubs at all, please go through the school office, as we need to know which children are at which club.
