Just a reminder that Oaks class assembly is on **Tuesday 13th November at 9am.**

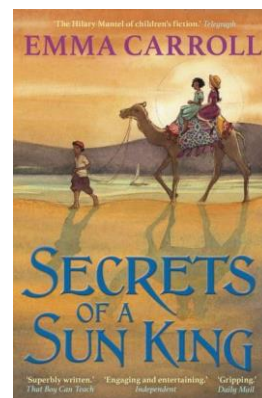
Loving books!
