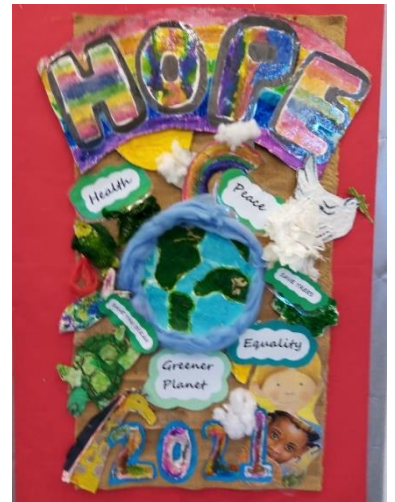

Return to school

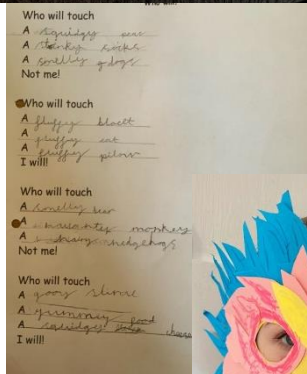
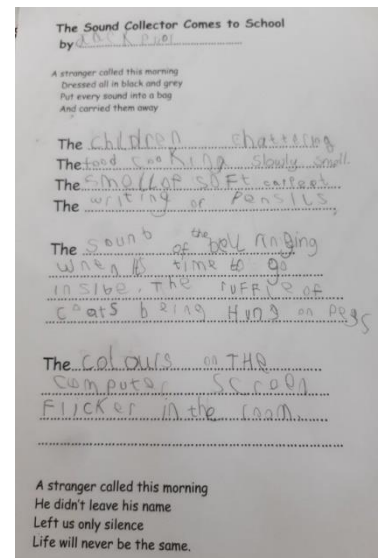
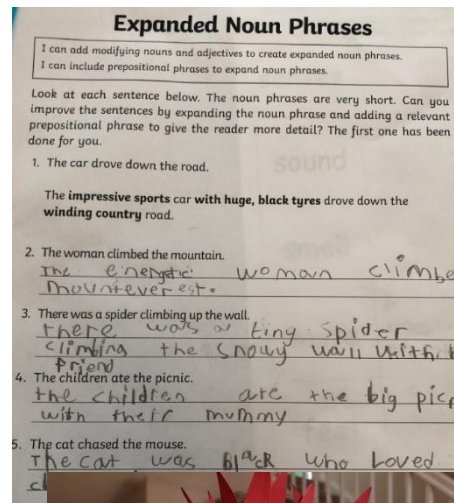
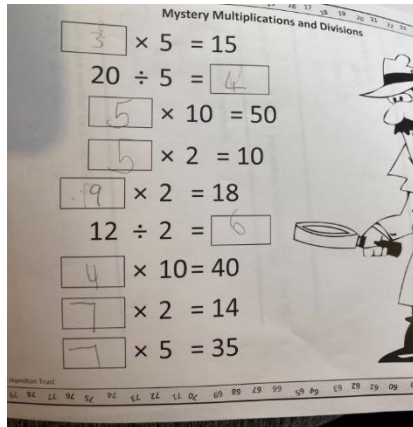
