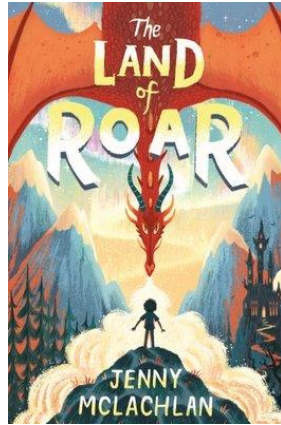


## The Land of Roar by Jenny McLachlan

**The Land of Roar** is a book that has the right properties to set your imagination on fire with excitement, joy and fantasy.
